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## Is Mixing Languages a Problem?

Mixing languages (code-switching) is a normal part of bilingual development. It reflects flexibility and linguistic adaptation — not confusion.

## What Research Tells Us

- Children can differentiate languages early in life.
- Code-switching shows social and cognitive flexibility.
- Total language exposure predicts development more than strict separation.

## How to Respond Calmly

- Model the full sentence in your chosen language without correction pressure.
- Maintain steady exposure in both languages.
- Focus on connection, not perfection.

## Key Reminder

Your child is not confused. They are building two language systems at once. Confidence and consistency matter more than rigid rules.
